

FROM THE PASTOR

Grief and hope comingle on that first Easter morning. The women come to the tomb grief stricken and traumatized by their experience on Friday. The most important person in the world to them has been ripped away in the most inglorious and cruel way. And then, to add insult to injury, they find the stone that guarded and protected Jesus' tomb rolled away when they come to anoint his body early Sunday morning. Is it grave robbers? Will they be denied even the simple act of honoring Jesus in death and saying their goodbyes? But then as quickly as their hearts are shattered all over again, something astonishing happens. Angels appear in gleaming bright clothing. Suddenly grief comingles with profound fear at these holy intruders.

But then hope breaks in. The angels proclaim that Jesus has been raised. The women find hope in their memories as they remember Jesus' words about being handed over and crucified...but then raised on the third day. A whisper of hope competes with the loudness of their grief. Could it be true? Oh, if only it is true. But could it be? It just seems too good to be true.

Grief, fear, hope, and doubt are all companions on that first glorious Easter morning. Grief does not neatly end before hope begins. And even when there is hope, grief still lurks in the background along with fear and doubts. It's a messy business, really, the Easter story. Since we know the end of the story, or really the new beginning the Easter story offers us, we are all to prone to jump ahead and focus only on the hope of Easter. However, we should also never forget the whole story of Easter. There is room for you to experience the glory and hope of Easter along with any grief, fear, and doubt you may be experiencing. Jesus meets us where we are and offers us hope in all circumstances.

Please join us for all our Holy Week events beginning on April 13 with Palm Sunday worship at 8:30 and 11 am. Maundy Thursday will feature the men's group doing a drama of the Last Supper at 7 pm. Then on Good Friday, we will gather at 5:15 pm at the church to carpool to the entrance to the Sam Davis home, from where we will carry the cross and hear scripture readings that remember Jesus' journey to the cross. Our Good Friday sanctuary service will then begin at 7 pm. On Saturday, April 19, please join us at 1 pm for our community Easter Egg Hunt. Finally, we will begin celebrating the resurrection on Easter, April 20, with a community sunrise service at 6 am at the Depot with Elder's Chapel and Cornerstone UMC's. Then join us in the sanctuary for 8:30 am modern and 11 am traditional Easter worship services.

We hope to see you on this most holy week of the entire church year. Please invite your neighbors, family, and friends to join us for Holy Week and Easter. Come and experience hope breaking into our world like never before as we celebrate the power of the resurrection.

In March our food pantry was blessed with an amazing gift from Second Harvest. We were given a grant of \$2000 to purchase food. This allowed us to stock up on the basic items we give out in our pantry. When we normally place an order with Second Harvest it



costs us anywhere from \$1,000 to \$1,200 and that will last us three to four weeks. Having this gift allowed us to give our budget a break for the

month of March. We still have to purchase cereal, oatmeal, Ramen noodles, crackers and various meats that we can't get at Second Harvest. That is why your participation in Sharing Sunday is so important.

In April we are asking for Ramen noodles to share. The congregation has been great at helping us each month in keeping our shelves stocked. The number of weekly clients in the pantry is still 45-50 families a week.

Please consider coming out on April 12 to help in our Adopta-Roadway ministry (check out page 4 for more details). Greg Upham does a fantastic job in organizing this activity and it makes you feel good to know you are helping keep our city clean.





"Who Is Your Generosity Mentor?"

"Who is your generosity mentor? That question was posed at a continuing education event I attended. Our instructor got our attention with the question, then followed with this statement: "Before we attempt to teach you how to grow generosity in others, it's important to reflect on who helped grow generosity in you."

Let me pause before I share my answer and ask you, "Who is your generosity mentor?"

I could have named a lot of people: my dad and many people who were members of churches I served as pastor. There are famous people who are very generous and some whose generosity is kept secret. There are people who have very little but are still incredibly generous. I tell a story in some of my workshops about orphan children from Liberia who collected an offering for children in the U.S. affected by Hurricane Katrina.

When the instructor at the continuing education event directed us to turn to the person next to us and share the story of our generosity mentor, one name came out without a moment's hesitation: Clayton Miller.

Clayton was my pastor when I was growing up. That United Methodist church was lucky enough to have his pastoral leadership for eighteen amazing years, through my school years and into college. When I described him to my neighbor, I was conscious that the generosity I described had nothing to do with money or financial support. He is such a generous person who shares his time, guidance, affirmation, joy, and so much more. He has a generous soul and a generous spirit, and there is no way I could believe he was anything but generous with money.

So, how would you answer the question: "Who is your generosity mentor?"

Philanthropy is born not from a fat financial portfolio but from a generous spirit and a heart of gratitude. Sometimes, the greatest impact we make in our giving comes not from the place that receives our donation but from our influence on others who follow our lead. So, the final question is this: "How will you mentor generosity to someone else?


