Answering the Question That Matters

When someone asks, "Why should I support this church?" it's not a challenge—it's an opening. It's an invitation to tell the story of what God is doing in our congregation and what might yet be possible.

So the next time someone asks why they should support your church, smile. It's your opportunity to share the story of God's movement in your midst and to invite others to be part of it.


A good answer doesn't defend your church; it reveals its purpose.

MISSIONS

Fall is finally here, and the busy holiday season is upon us. The turkey is perched at the back of the sanctuary for you to sign up to provide a Thanksgiving basket for those in our community who struggle to put food on their table. Just choose a large family or a small family and give us your name so we'll know how many baskets we will have to distribute. This has been a popular project for many years, and we hope to continue to bless many of our food pantry participants. We will need the baskets at the church no later than November 16, but you may bring them earlier if needed. We no longer put fresh meat in the basket but a gift card to a local store for \$10-\$15 will give them the option to purchase their own meat and possibly a dessert. We are not including fresh desserts as they will be stale by Thanksgiving but if you feel led to add a box of brownie mix or cookie mix they can make their own.

In addition to the Turkey baskets, the table is in the narthex with shoe boxes that need to be filled so a child in various regions around the world can receive a gift this Christmas. There are only a few of the printed Christmas Child boxes but under the table are suitable boxes that will work just as well. You may even decorate those boxes if you feel you want to make it more festive. There are lists that give suggestions for appropriate items to include in your box. Remember to remove all items from their package so you can get more in the box. This gift may be the first time a child has heard of the birth and life of Christ, and you can be part of that mission.

We will be providing an Angel tree again this year so watch for the tree to go up at the end of November. God has provided us with so many ways to bless those less fortunate, and we hope all of you will continue to open your hearts to give to those in need.

LEADERSHIP BOARD REPORT

The Leadership Board had its monthly meeting on October 26. One action that was taken was approving and accepting a bid from Dow Smith Construction to install new doors at the entrance to the sanctuary, to have the outside door in the chancel area repaired and to replace the ramp door which takes us into the Chapel and office area. The purpose of this project is: 1. to replace old doors that can no longer be repaired; and 2. to provide doors that are more secure and will create a safer environment for our membership and visitors. Thanks to Scott Buchholz and Derwin Brownlow for their work on this.

As pastor Theresa will return to the pulpit November 2, we will begin putting into motion some of the suggestions we received from Small Fish Branding. 
