

FROM THE PASTOR:

The good news of Easter is too joyous, too marvelous, and too important to be confined to one day of celebration. Therefore, church tradition allots a whole season to celebrate and be immersed in the joy of the good news of Christ's resurrection. The Easter Season, also known as the Great Fifty Days, begins at sunset the day before Easter and continues through the Day of Pentecost. And even beyond these fifty days, every Sunday throughout the year when we gather to worship is considered a little Easter. Every Sunday is a day to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus.

Our celebration of the Resurrection is not limited to that one glorious day we call Easter when we cheerily share the good news with one another that Christ is risen! We are Easter people 365 days a year. We acknowledge this beautiful truth of the continual celebration of the Resurrection in that wonderful hymn "Easter People, Raise Your Voices." We sing in the last stanza of that hymn: "Every day to us is Easter, with its resurrection song. When in trouble move the faster to our God who rights the wrong. Alleluia! Alleluia! See the power of heavenly throngs."

Yes, the Resurrection of Jesus was a specific historical event in a specific moment of time in the past. But what Christ accomplished on that first Easter Sunday morning unleashed the power and promise of Resurrection life for all

humanity and indeed all of creation once and for all. It means we live our lives no longer fearing death. We live our lives knowing sin does not control us. We live our lives knowing that even when everything goes wrong, God has the power to right every wrong. Because of the ongoing work of Christ's Resurrection in and among us, we live with hope regardless of our circumstances. So, happy Easter, friends! Let's continue our Easter celebrations beyond Sunday, March 31 and keep the Alleluias coming for the next fifty days and beyond, because Christ is risen! He is risen indeed...then, now, and forever. Amen.



The Church Council voted at its last meeting to form a task group to put together a proposed structure for a simplified board plan for the future oversight of the church. This is a comprehensive assignment that encompasses a variety of responsibilities, all of which are necessary if the congregation is to accomplish its vision for ministry.

WHAT DOES THE FINANCE COMMITTEE DO?

Taken from Guidelines for Leading Your Congregation "Finance", 2017-2020. Copyright 2016 Cokesbury. Used by permission In *The Book of Discipline* the committee on finance is charged with all these activities:

- Oversee stewardship,
- Compile a budget annually,
- Raise sufficient income to meet the budget,
- Administer funds received by the church,
- Count and deposit the offering,
- Disburse funds,
- Establish internal control policies,
- Review and report annually on the adequacy and effectiveness of internal controls.
- Provide for an annual audit of the church financial
- Report to the annual charge conference on the audit,
- Recommend proper depositories for church funds,
- Use contributions in accordance with donors' intent,
- Report annually to the church council all designated funds that are separate from the church budget.

(Each month we will be looking at the role of the leadership committees we have at SFUMC and their responsibilities. If you would like a copy of the Guidelines for your specific committee, please notify the church office.)

On March 20 we served 59 families and we are thankful we could provide them with enough food to get them by for a few days. The committee is looking for ways to supplement our budget as we are running through our budget at a much faster pace than we ever anticipated. If you are able to contribute we would

really appreciate it. We are currently looking into another source of food that would be at a much reduced cost and we are also looking into ways to get support from other companies or agencies. On a more personal level if you want to pick up some boxes of cereal or crackers or instant oatmeal we would be grateful.

Our mission team leaves for the Sager Brown UMCOR Depot on April 14 and we ask for your prayers for a safe journey. We look forward to helping the Depot prepare for disasters in any way we are needed. If you want to contribute to the project, we are still accepting donations to be applied to supplies in lieu of physical items. We just don't have room this year to take physical items as we have in the past. All donations will be given to Sager Brown to help with the cost of supplies for disaster kits.

We are thankful for the support we receive from this congregation to continue our ministries and missions. We pray God will continue to guide us in our mission to help others and spread the love of Christ.

ARE WE STEWARDS?

I was honored when I was asked to be the stewardship team leader for Smyrna First United Methodist Church (ok, right now I'm the "leader" of a team of one). Stewardship is my passion, and it's great when your passion is your job as well. I love to help people see stewardship in a broader sense than simply making the budget and paying the bills (certainly, those are important). Jesus spoke often in the Bible about stewards – those stories about people who are entrusted by "the master" (some important person who has property or monetary resources of value) to care for what the master owns while he is somewhere far away. In each story, there is a moment when the master returns to hold these stewards accountable for how well they have watched over what has been put in their care.

When we see ourselves as stewards of all God has entrusted to us, we begin to see that it's not just about what we give, but how we live faithfully with all we have. We remember that we have nothing that doesn't come from God's goodness and love for us.



More than fifty years ago, the world set aside April 22 as Earth Day, and since then it has been a month when we try to bring people's attention to care for this planet. I believe our stewardship extends to God making us stewards of God's good creation. So, this is an appropriate month for us to ponder a definition of stewardship that is broad.

If there is hope of reversing the growing climate crisis, it will happen when our leaders, our neighbors, and all of us take seriously our role as stewards of God's creation. As people of faith who have been taught what it means to be faithful stewards, we can lead the way!
